

The villages of Potter and Dix can be found in the southern panhandle of Nebraska. Dix has a population of approximately 200 people and Potter has a population of approximately 350 people. The Elementary school (K-6) is in Dix. The Junior and Senior High Schools are in Potter. In addition to providing a strong foundation in the core subjects, Potter-Dix Schools also offers dual credit secondary course offerings, and a wide variety of extra-curricular programs. The district also works with Volunteers of America – Northern Rockies to offer early childhood and preschool services. Student performance has been strong as evidenced by ACT and state assessment scores. Potter-Dix Schools employs an excellent staff of 21 teachers, 2 administrators, 1 school counselor, 2 secretaries, 4 cooks, 2 custodians, 4 bus drivers and 6 paraprofessionals who work with students daily.


